## IDIOMS & PHRASES

### 1) Pull a fast one (on somebody)

**MEANING:** perfect conditions

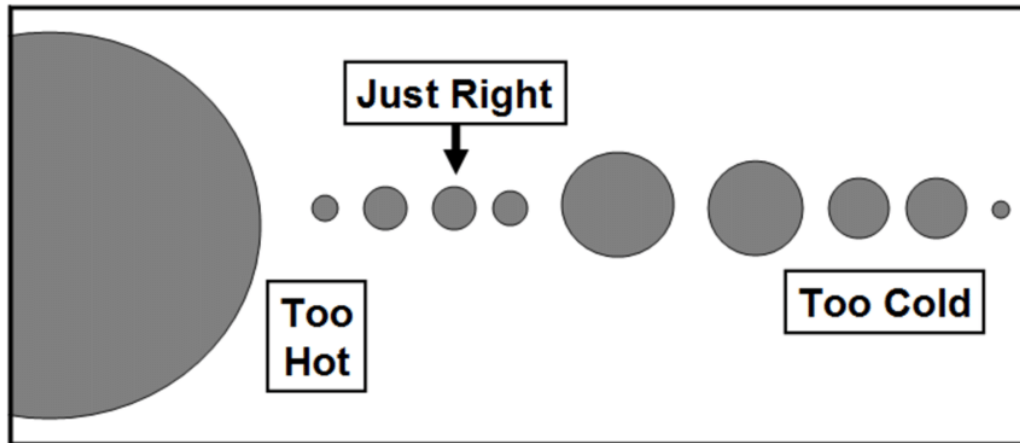
**USAGE:** I am going to build a house in the Goldilocks zone in Switzerland it is a very nice area with beautiful homes.

## SAME WORD USED AS NOUN AND VERB

### 1) Freight

**Noun:** goods transported in bulk by truck, train, ship, or aircraft.

**E.g.:** The train is packed with freight that will be delivered to the depot this evening.

**Verb:** transport (goods) in bulk by truck, train, ship, or aircraft.

**E.g.:** the metals had been freighted from the city

## 1) Freight

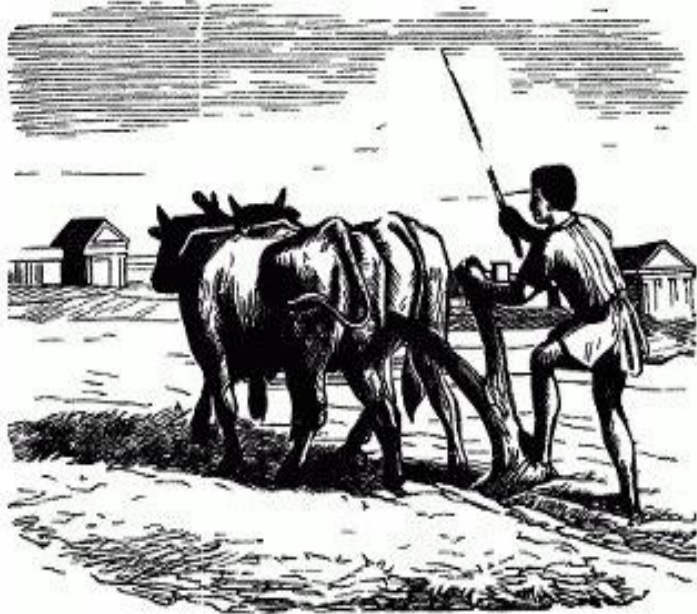

## SAME WORD USED AS NOUN AND VERB

### 1) Goad



**Noun:** a spiked stick used for driving cattle/a thing that stimulates someone into action.

**E.g.:** for him the visit was a goad to renewed effort.

**Verb:** provoke or annoy (someone) so as to stimulate an action or reaction.

**E.g.:** he was trying to goad her into a fight.

**HAUL**

**Howl - cry of wolf/a loud cry of pain, anger**

**e.g.:** The child was howling in wee hours of the morning.

**Haul - pull or drag with force**

**e.g.:-** The mendicant was hired to haul the furniture and luggage.

**Ingenuous - innocent, unsuspecting mostly in a childish way**

**e.g.:** He could not satisfy the board through his ingenuous replies.

**Ingenious - clever, original or inventive**

**e.g.:-** He is known for his ingenious way of handling difficult situations.

## PHRASAL VERB

### 1) Throw open

**Meaning:** to open completely and suddenly/to remove all restrictions from

**e.g.:** The discussion was then thrown open for the audience's questions.

### 2) Contend with

Meaning: To cope with, grapple with

e.g.: The new governor had great difficulties to contend with.
